

Advanced Placement

In recent research, it has been found that students who take AP courses and earn a 2 on the exam are more likely to perform better in college introductory classes than students who do not. Furthermore, students who achieve exam scores of 1 or 2 are still more likely to attend college and graduate on time (than academically similar students who do not take AP).

Advanced Placement helps students stand out to colleges:

Most colleges and universities use AP as a factor in evaluating candidates for admission. This gives you an advantage when you're applying to colleges and trying to stand out from the crowd. By taking an AP Exam, you're showing admissions officers you're motivated to succeed and can stick with a commitment.

85% of colleges and universities report a student's AP experience favorably impacts admission decisions.

Finally, taking AP and passing an AP exam can save you time and money:

The majority of AP students earn college credit in high school. If you score a 3 or higher on an AP Exam, you can earn college credit and/or placement. Check out the [credit policies](#) at schools you're interested in to learn more about the types of credit they grant for your courses.

Earning college credit with AP can give you the flexibility to change majors, pursue a second degree, study abroad, or transfer colleges. Earning advanced placement can let you skip introductory courses in college, freeing up more time in your schedule for courses you're interested in or giving you a chance to graduate early.
