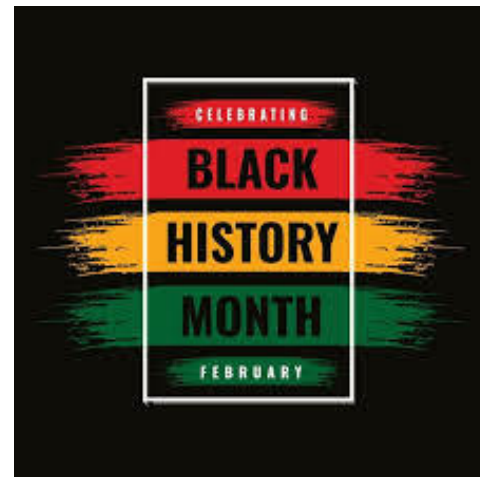

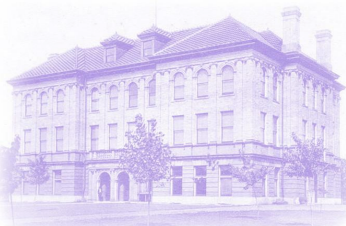

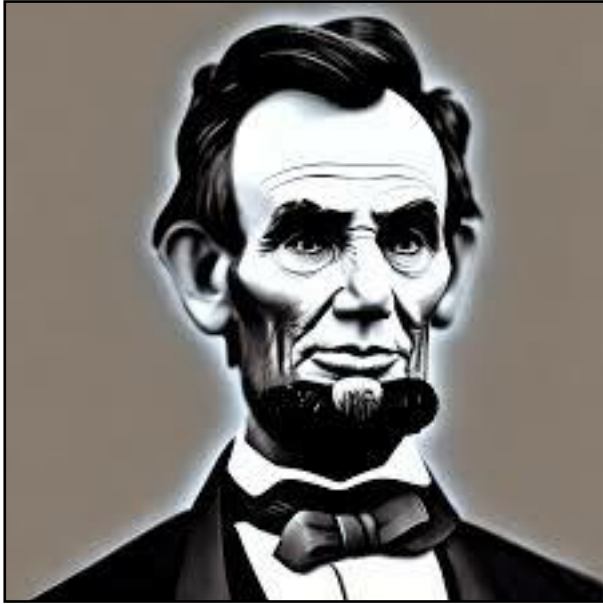

# Remembering Abraham Lincoln

*in honor of President's Day on February 19th, 2024*

Abraham Lincoln, born on February 12, 1809, holds a pivotal place in American history as the 16th President of the United States. Coming from humble beginnings in a log cabin in Kentucky, Lincoln's journey is a testament to the American dream. Despite facing economic hardships and limited formal education, he emerged as a self-educated individual with a deep passion for the law. Lincoln's early career saw him working various jobs, from a rail-splitter to a store clerk, before he entered into politics in the Illinois State Legislature.

What makes Lincoln truly stand out is his leadership during one of the nation's most challenging time periods—the Civil War. Elected as president in 1860, he faced the immediate and daunting task of preserving the Union as Southern states seceded. Lincoln's unwavering commitment to maintaining the integrity of the nation and his opposition to the spread of slavery into new territories positioned him as a symbol of unity and justice. His leadership during the Civil War showcased his ability to navigate a divided nation and communicate effectively, leaving a mark on American history.

Lincoln's legacy is perhaps most prominently marked by his role in ending slavery. # Influential Black Artists

In honor of the 2024 Black History Month theme of "African Americans and the Arts," I wanted to pay tribute to the Black artists and entertainers that have inspired me throughout the years. I think it is important to recognize how African American culture contributes to pop culture and society as a whole. The following list contains information about some of the greatest artists of all time (in my humble opinion).

#1 - **Beyonce**. Beyonce Knowles-Carter is a prominent figure in pop culture. She is widely referred to as "The Queen" or "Queen B". Her Renaissance World Tour earned \$580 Million, making it one of the most successful World tours of all time. Her iconic music videos, instantly recognizable songs and unparalleled stage presence have made her a cultural phenomenon and she is considered the greatest performer of all time. She challenged stereotypes and broke the mold of the music industry by being a perfect pop star and unapologetically Black.



#2 - **Zendaya**. Zendaya became the youngest, highest paid black actress on a TV show with Euphoria. Her start on the Disney channel shows "Shake it Up" and "K.C Undercover" made her an icon amongst Gen Z. She is multifaceted, being a singer, actor, dancer and model. She was named one of the 100 most influential people in the world by Time Magazine. With 54 nominations and 34 wins, it's obvious that Zendaya is here to stay.

#3 - **Charles Alston**. Active during the Harlem renaissance, Charles Alston was an important member of the black community. Commonly referred to as a race man, which is an African American man who dedicates his life to furthering the Black race, Alston became known as a prominent figure during the Renaissance Era. He is known for painting, sculpting, illustration and muralism. He moved to New York during the great migration and by the 1930's he was doing artwork for famous magazines. He ended up becoming the first black instructor at the museum of modern art.



#4 - **Michael Jackson**. "The king of pop music" himself, Michael Jackson is globally recognized as the most iconic, legendary and influential music artist of all time. He was a pioneer in the art of music videos and is a big part of the reason people even make music videos today. His immediately recognizable, fashion, poses, dance moves and catchphrases definitely makes him a pillar in black history. Michael Jackson began singing at a very early age when he was a member of the group "The Jackson 5" along with his brothers. He was undeniably a living legend by the time the mid 80's came around, but since he was trying to make a name for himself as a solo artist in the 1970's, many people in the industry underestimated him because he was black.

#5 - **Rihanna**. Everyone and their mothers know the one and only Rihanna. The 2023 Super Bowl performer has been making hits since she was 19 with her debut single "Pon De Replay," which spent 12 weeks inside the top 10 of the hot 100 and peaked at number one on the US Billboard Dance Club Songs and Digital Songs charts. She's a singer, actor, songwriter and a businesswoman. Her brands Fenty Beauty and Savage X Fenty have made her a billionaire, fashion mogul and absolute powerhouse of the beauty industry. The last album she made was nearly a decade ago and she has everyone constantly wanting more.



#6 - **James Baldwin**. This American author and Civil Rights activist is one of the strongest queer voices in Black history. He was born August 2, 1927 and broke literary ground with his intelligent views on spiritualism, race and social issues. Unfortunately he gained his eighth sibling and lost his father on the same day. In 1953, he had his first novel published, it was named '*Go Tell It on the Mountain*.' He broke new ground in 1954 with his novel, '*Giovanni's Room*' which followed a complex depiction of homosexuality, which at the time was nearly unspoken. He paved the way for Black and queer

literature.

#7 - **Grace Jones**. This androgynous fashion icon is a 75 year old Jamaican model, actor, singer, producer, and songwriter. Her 1977 record deal resulted in a string of club-dance hits. She established herself as a major recording artist by earning considerable success in the market. Her influence is still present in today's fashion and makeup is still present with bold colors and creative patterns being something she experimented with.



#8 - **Ella Fitzgerald**. Known as "The First Lady of Song", Ella Fitzgerald was a revolutionary American Jazz singer. Born in April of 1917, she was one of the first Black entertainers to perform all around the world. Her ability to improvise with her scatting and her show off her vocal range is notable. Fitzgerald was the first African American to win more than one Grammy. She was also one of the first Super Bowl halftime performers. The superstar died in 1996 of a stroke, but her contribution to African American culture will not be forgotten.

The TTHS Varsity boys basketball team is on fire this season! They are currently 21-3 overall and are ranked #1 in the Southland basketball standings. Their most recent game against Kankakee on January 30th was a nail-biter with a close score of 59-54, taking home another win!

The Boys Varsity Wrestling Team went 7-0 this year in team competition. They won the regular season Conference. At the SAC conference tournament, the team had 4 Champions. Ranked Senior wrestlers Lionel Senior and Qilee Jackson took 1st place. Two sophomores, Brandon Dumas and Emmanuel Adedeji, took 1st place also. Adrian Valadez and Taofeeq Amuda took 2nd place. Ryan Jackson and Avionnae Butler took 3rd place. The Varsity wrestlers start the IHSA State series at Regionals held at Marist High School on Saturday, February 3rd. They have several top seeds going into the tournament.



The Girls Wrestling Team competed in the first IHSA regionals for girls. They placed 4th out of 37 teams total. They took 7 wrestlers and 6 placed to advance to the Sectional tournament. Freshman Gymaria Brown and Senior Keyhanna Phillips took 1st place. Ranked wrestler Jalah Wilson took 3rd place and hopes to return to the State meet this year.
